The President's Message

Is your chapter keeping up with the goals for the Yellow Rose Award? Here are the tasks which each chapter should complete during the second year of this biennium:

- Send at least six (6) newsletters or minutes to the state officers.
- ✓ Initiate or reinstate one member or host a membership event.
- √ Have a chapter program about Crohn's & Colitis or make a donation to the CCFA.
- Have one (1) World Understanding program.
- ✓ Be part of the nomination/application process-choose one of the following options:
 - * Nominate a sister for Excellence in Education
 - * Nominate a community leader for TX AΔK Woman of Honor
 - ★ Nominate a sister for TX AΔK of Distinction
 - * Have a chapter member apply for an AΔK scholarship (may be from the first or second year of the biennium)

Because some of these requirements are difficult to verify, each chapter will receive a form to check off their completed tasks. Be looking for this form near the end of the biennium. Achieving these goals is important for giving us a common purpose and for keeping our organization relevant and strong in today's world.



It's Time to Offer for State Office-**Applications Due by February 15**

President-Elect, Vice President for Membership, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Historian, Sergeant-at-Arms, Chaplain, President of the Council of Chapter Presidents

Here are the eligibility requirements:

- 1. A candidate for any office must have been a member of $A\Delta K$ for at least three years.
- 2. A candidate for any office shall have served as president of a chapter and shall have attended at least one state convention.
- 3. A candidate for president-elect shall have attended at least one International Convention.
- 4. A candidate for president-elect shall have served at least one term on the state executive board as an elected officer.
- 5. A candidate shall attend the convention in which she is an eligible candidate.
- 6. The state president and president-elect shall not hold a chapter or district office.

Nominate a Sister for

Texas Alpha Delta Kappa of Distinction

At each Texas A Δ K State Convention, a member will be elected by a majority vote of registered delegates to be recognized as Texas A Δ K of Distinction.

The sister must:

- Be a member in good standing for at least 10 years.
- Have served as an officer or committee member above the chapter level.
- Have attended at least two state conventions, one regional conference and one International convention.
- Have made notable contributions to the advancement of Texas AΔK.
- Not be a candidate for state office at the time of nomination as Texas AΔK of Distinction.
- Not be currently serving on the State Executive Board of Texas A∆K.

A member will be nominated for Texas AΔK of Distinction when a chapter has submitted a nomination form to the committee chairman, Johnna West, by the deadline of March 15, 2022. The chairman and her committee will screen the nominees' resumes, which will then be published in the state newsletter and displayed at the convention. A list of previous recipients can be found in the box to the right. The nomination form is included in a separate forms email. It is also posted on the state website.



Scholarship Opportunities for Texas $A\Delta K$ Members

Regional Mini-Scholarships (Spring) Under the umbrella of the Regional Professional Development Scholarships, Alpha Delta Kappa International annually allocates each region \$3,000 to distribute to current* members, whether actively engaged in teaching or not, who apply to attend non AΔK-sponsored conferences, conventions, seminars, workshops and non-credit classes. Graduate and/or doctoral studies are beyond the scope of this program. The maximum scholarship is \$500.

Applications shall be submitted through the online link. Applications for activities taking place between May 15 and November 15 must be submitted no later than April 15. To be eligible for a Regional Mini-Scholarship, an AΔK member shall not have received a Regional Mini Scholarship during the current fiscal year (June 1 — May 31).

Mary Elizabeth Taliaferro Scholarship This is our \$1000 Texas scholarship awarded annually. Please take advantage of this wonderful opportunity. It is to be used for graduate study or additional certification. Due February 15, 2022.

Texas Mini-MET Scholarship

The Mini-MET Scholarship is offered twice a year. All Texas A Δ K members are eligible to apply. It is intended to help fund non-A Δ K sponsored workshops, conferences and other activities for personal enrichment. The amount is capped at \$300 per recipient. Due April 15.

Both scholarship applications are posted on the state website and should be sent to Marsha McKinney, State Scholarship Chairman.



I have been asked to work on revising the list of Texas Sisters who are Sustaining/Limited members. Texas has 38 sisters listed in the Sustaining Chapter, five of whom are limited. Do you know the difference between the two categories of membership?

SUSTAINING MEMBER: An active member who is not affiliated with a chartered chapter.

LIMITED MEMBER: A member who is permanently incapable of fulfilling her obligations and responsibilities as an active member of Alpha Delta Kappa.

Sustaining members can attend district and state meetings. I know they would love the invitation to attend those functions. A roster of the Texas Sustaining Chapter is available to view in the Directory on the Alpha Delta Kappa website.

When a chapter disbands, joining the Sustaining Chapter is one of the options a sister has. Resignation and transfer are the other two options. Those sisters might be interested in attending nearby chapter meetings occasionally. Give them a call if they are indeed close by.

Let's work to keep these sisters in touch with the organization. Please try to contact any of the sisters in your area. If you know of someone on the Sustaining list joining Omega Chapter, please notify one of the state officers.
